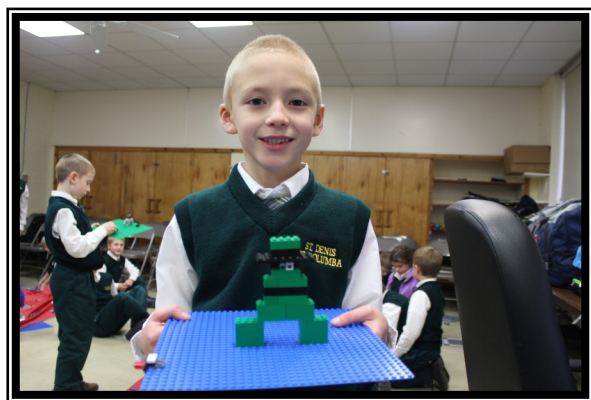

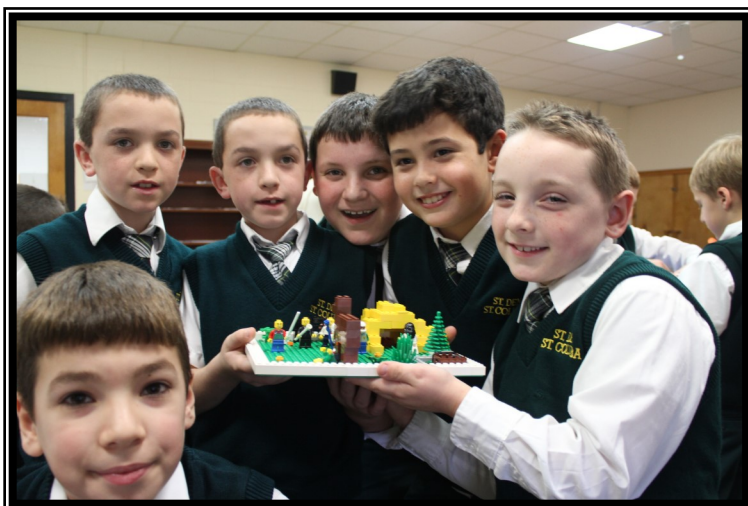
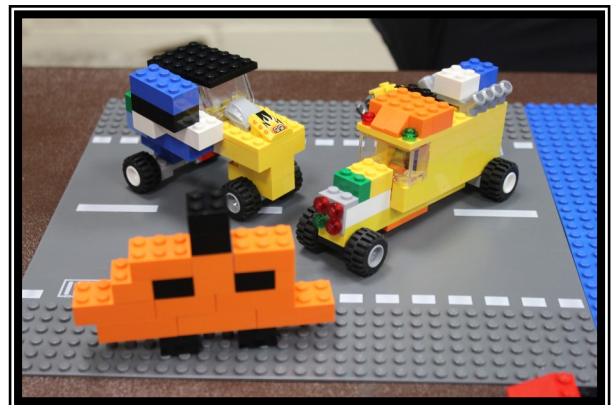

## Did You Know?

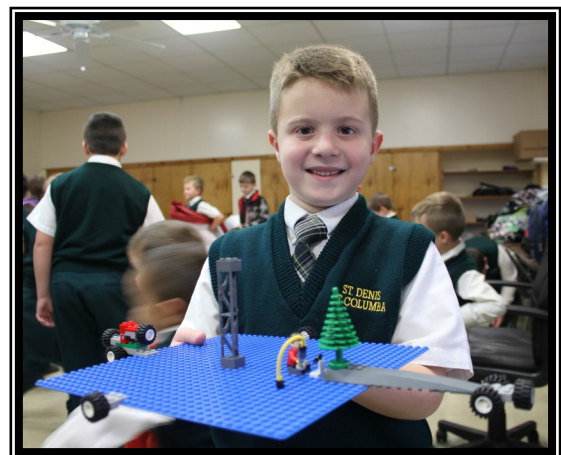
- The LEGO® name is made from the first two letters of the Danish words LEG GODT, meaning “play well”.

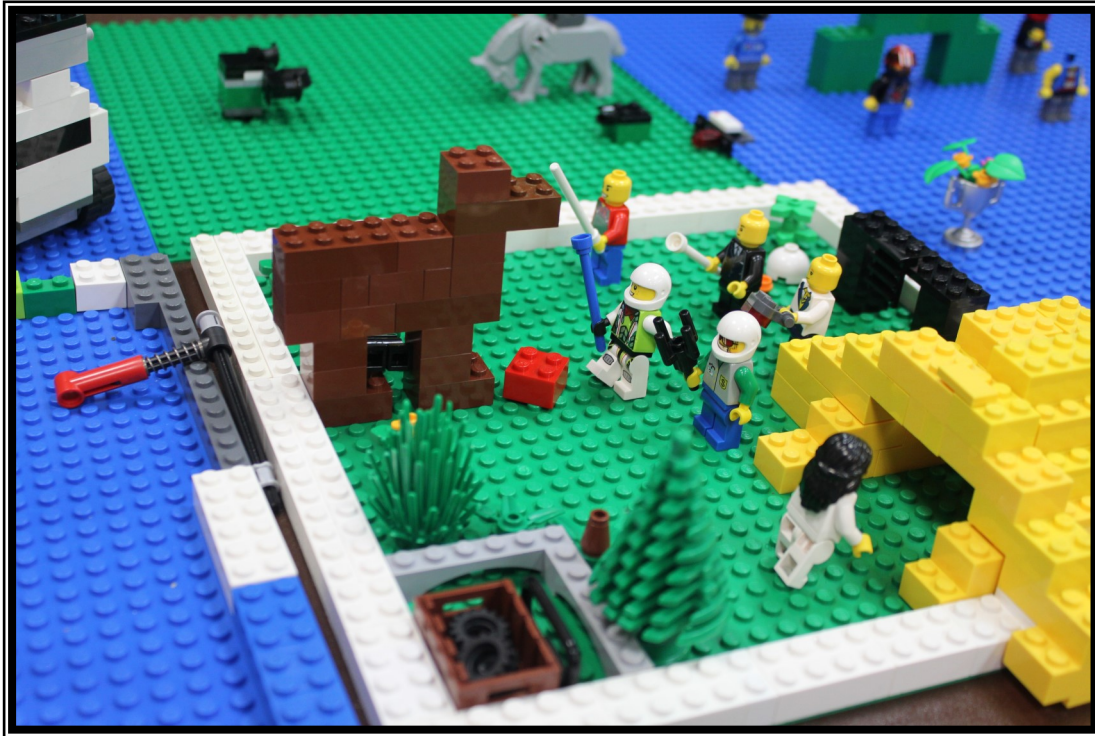
