Ash Wednesday and the Season of Lent

This **Wednesday**, **March 1**st we begin the Holy Season of Lent, which is a time of prayer, fasting (sacrifice), and almsgiving (acts of charity). During this season, we are strongly urged to participate in Mass and receive Holy Communion daily, to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation, to attend Lenten Devotions and the Stations of the Cross, to read the Scriptures prayerfully, to perform acts of self-denial and works of mercy.

The specific discipline of the Church in the United States regarding penitential days is as follows:

- \circ The days of fast and abstinence are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.
- o The other Fridays of Lent are DAYS OF ABSTINENCE (no meat)
- o The Fridays of the year, outside Lent, are designated as DAYS OF PENANCE, but each individual may substitute for the traditional abstinence from meat some other practice of voluntary self-denial as penance. This may be physical mortification or acts of religion, charity or Christian witness.

All are welcome to attend the Ash Wednesday Prayer Service for the school community at 9:15 a.m. this Wednesday, March 1st. As a school we also will be praying the Divine Mercy Chaplet at 9:00 a.m. in the church if you would like to join us. Happy Lent!

On Friday, March 3rd we will be celebrating as a faith community our Lenten school liturgy. You are welcome to join us as we gather for mass as a school community at **10:00 a.m. in the Church.**

The Importance of i-Ready and Weekly i-Ready Homework

You, our school families, entrust us at SDSC to provide your children with the best education possible. Because of this we have made a significant investment of funds and staff training to provide our students with *i-Ready*, an individualized online instruction program for both Math and Reading. This program provides three educational advantages for our students. It reinforces topics taught in the classroom and enables the students to practice them until they achieve mastery. It self-adjusts to give students remedial assistance in areas of weakness while simultaneously growing their areas of strength. It provides our faculty with immediate results so that they can address student needs.

We expect our students to complete *i-Ready* instruction lessons both at home and in school each week. *i-Ready* is only as effective as the commitment of teachers, parents and students. There is a homework component to this program. Those students who do not have adequate computer access at home will continue to be provided time after school to complete their lessons. In addition, students who are unable to complete the lessons at home in a timely manner will be required to stay after school to do so. Parents, please understand that this is not a punishment or a detention. Instead, it is an opportunity for the students to take full advantage of this great educational program. If you have any questions about the *i-Ready* instructional program requirements, please contact Sr. Kathleen.

We at SDSC continue to work hard to assist our students in achieving their potential in both Math and Reading. The students in grades Grades 4-8 are to complete a minimum of 2 lessons per week per subject. The students in Grades K-3 are to complete a minimum of 30 minutes in Math and 30 minutes in Reading each week. Sr. Kathleen is available on most Wednesdays after school and can meet with anyone who needs computer time to work on their *i-Ready*.

Re-Registration for 2017-2018 School Year

A couple of weeks ago your children received a packet of information regarding tuition and busing for the 2017-2018 School Year. If you haven't done so already, please be sure to return the parishioner verification (if applicable) and transportation forms by this week. If you have any questions, please call the school office.

You should have also received a separate email for <u>each</u> of your children who will be attending SDSC in the Fall. This email was sent from <u>support@tads.com</u>. It included a brief overview of the registration process and a link unique to your child's information for enrollment, including related payment due and grade level for 2017-2018 school year.

Re-Registration fees are applied to each student registered and are due at the time of re-registration. A reduced Re-Registration fee rate is offered to those students who are registered by February 28, 2017. You must complete this process by this date to receive the reduced re-registration rate (after this date the re-registration fee is \$100). Please use the link in each email you receive in order to see the correct information for the 2017-2018 school year. Payments are to be made per student.
